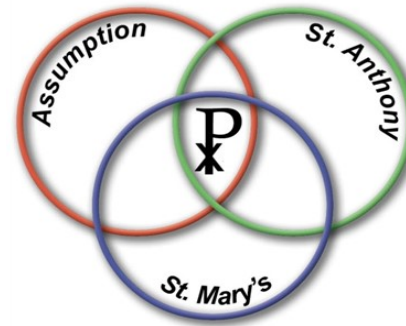

Pope's Tweet ... "Those who protect children are on God's side and triumph over those who oppress them. Let us free every child from every form of exploitation!"

Father's Corner Vocations: Today is the **World Day of Vocations**. A Vocation is an overall call from God on a way to live your life. It is a way to answer the question on "How can I give back to God the gifts that God has given to me?" There are several vocation calls. Holy Orders including Priesthood, Permanent Deaconate; Married Life; Religious Life and dedicated Single Life; from the Holy Father's address about World Day of Pray for Vocations. 2018 is a special year for vocations, because the Synod of Bishops will reflect on young people, especially "the relationship between young people, faith, and vocation". Pope Francis reminded Christians that God never ceases to call men and women to follow Him. "We are not victims of chance or swept up in a series of unconnected events; on the contrary, our life and our presence in this world are the fruit of a divine vocation," he said. He said the mystery of the Incarnation shows that God constantly "comes to encounter us", even in troubled times. "In the diversity and the uniqueness of each and every vocation, personal and ecclesial, there is a need to **listen, discern and live** this word that calls to us from on high and, while enabling us to develop our talents, makes us instruments of salvation in the world and guides us to full happiness." These three aspects – **listening, discerning and living** – were also present at beginning of Jesus' own mission, when, after his time of prayer and struggle in the desert, he visited his synagogue of Nazareth. There, he listened to the word, discerned the content of the mission entrusted to him by the Father, and proclaimed that he came to accomplish it "today" (Lk 4:16-21).
