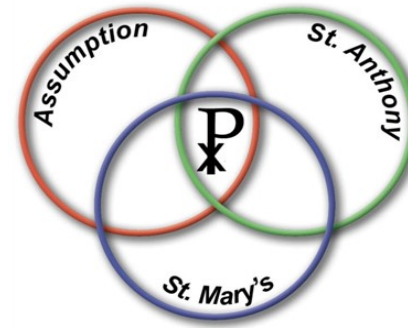


May 20, 2018 - Pentecost Sunday

We are many parts, we are all one body.

Father's Corner . . . Today we are celebrating Pentecost. Pentecost, because it is the fiftieth day since Easter, it is a day when we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and upon each of us at our own Confirmation. Easter and Pentecost are closely linked as one. Jesus and the Holy Spirit, with the Father are 1 God. Following 1 plan of salvation. Jesus showing us the way and the Holy Spirit guiding us and lighting our way. Together they follow the Father and lead us to Heaven. Pentecost is the Birthday of the Church. Today we turn 1985 years old. 2018-33=1985.

Pentecost focuses on the gifts of the Holy Spirit coming upon us. There are commonly 7 specific gifts, but each gift is different in each of us and how it is used by each of us is also different. The 7 gifts are intended for the sanctification of the person who receives them. From Is 11:2-3

1. Wisdom: Helps us to relish and love the things of heaven.
 2. Understanding: helps us to grasp the truths of our religion.
 3. Counsel: enables us to see and choose correctly what will help most to the glory of God and our own salvation.
 4. Fortitude: the courage to overcome the obstacles and difficulties that arise in the practice of our religious duties.
 5. Knowledge: points out to us the path to follow and the dangers to avoid in order to reach heaven.
 6. Piety (godliness): helps us to joyfully embrace all that pertains to the service of God.
- Fear of the Lord: To respect God, His awesomeness and His love. And because of His love for us and our love for Him to not want to sin against Him.

These 7 gifts are qualities that help us be attentive to the voice of God in our lives and render us more able and willing to receive grace from God so that we can love the things of God and be open to the inspiration of the Holy Spirit and to what God intends of and for us.

She spends many evenings and weekends with our Jr. High and High students in classes, planning with the children for events, putting on retreats, Bible studies, Training the Young Adults to lead events and many other things. We are all proud of her and thank her for all of her hard work. In talking about all that Debbie has done, we also need to mention and thank her husband Joe. He not only puts up with all her time spent with our youth, so many evenings and weekends of sacrificing family time so she can spend it with our youth; he also helps with many of the events directly or in building and transporting the things Debbie needs for the different events.
