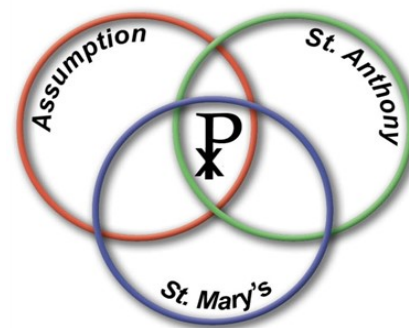

Father's Corner ... Creed Continued: (3) Who was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, The eternal Word, the substantial Image of the Father, became incarnate, without losing his divine nature He has assumed human nature. As for why God did this, the Nicene Creed expands and says "for us and for our salvation." To reconcile us with God. So that we could live, Jn 3,16 1 Jn 4,9. The Nicene Creed further expands on this point to make clear that Jesus is truly God and truly human. Conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit states how this miracle occurred. This is reinforced by born of the Virgin Mary showing Jesus had no human father-God is His Father, but Jesus is human because He has a human mother – Mary.

(4) suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried: This is the Paschal mystery of the cross and Resurrection- the center of the Good News that the Apostles and the Church follow. The death of Jesus was not the result of chance but is part of the mystery of God's plan as Peter says Act2, 23. This divine plan does not mean that those who did it were passive players in the story. They chose to do what they did. The Nicene Creed explains why Jesus did this. It says for "our sakes" because of our sins 1 Cor 15,3 God did this because of His love for us. Was buried: This shows he was really dead. It is a link between before Easter and His glorious risen state. His body was dead but saw no corruption because of His divine person.
