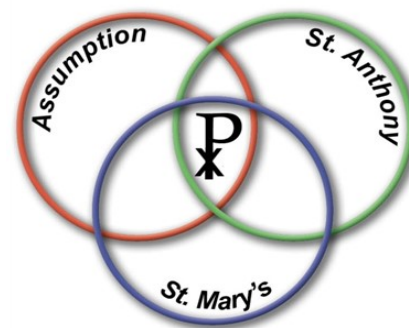

Father's Corner ... Creed Continued:

(5) he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; "Descended into hell" hell in Hebrew Sheol in Greek Hades is the realm of the dead. In the New Testament it is not the realm of Satan, but of those who had died. People like Adam, Abraham, Joseph and John the Baptist. Jesus went there as the Savior to preach the Good News. He did not go to the Damned but to those in the bosom of Abraham, Lk 16,22-26 "On the third day He rose again from the dead" this is the crowning truth of our faith. Shown by the empty tomb and the appearance of Christ. Believed and taught by the disciples who encountered the risen Christ. It is still a mystery, none saw the resurrection happen only the results. It transcends and surpasses history. Christ is the First Born from the Dead Col 1,18, is the principle of our own resurrection, even now by the justification of our souls Rom 6,4 and one day by the new life he will impart to our bodies, Rom 8,11. (6) he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; "he ascended into heaven" This marks the entrance of Jesus humanity into God's heavenly domain. Jesus as the head of the Church precedes us into the Father's kingdom. So that we, as members of His body, may live in the hope of being with Him forever. and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty: being at the right hand of the leader is the highest place of honor. (7) from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. The reign of Christ is already present in His Church, His body on earth, but His reign is yet to be fulfilled, with the power and great glory by His return to earth. Lk 21,27 We live in the time of waiting and watching. A time marked by distress and the trial of evil and ushers in the struggles of the last days. "Judge the living and the dead." At the end of time Christ will be the judge of all. He will reveal the secrets of all hearts and will render to each one according to his works and according to his acceptance or refusal of grace. (8) I believe in the Holy Spirit: None can say Jesus is Lord except by the Holy Spirit 1 Cor 12,3 'Because you are sons, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying Abba Father' Gal 4,6. The Nicene Creed adds to this to help clarify Who the Holy Spirit is. It says: "who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the Prophets." Showing that the Holy Spirit is "consubstantial" with the Father and the Son and that from the beginning the mission of the Father, Son and Spirit is conjoined and inseparable. It is by the Holy Spirit that the Incarnation happened as also covered in point #3. It is by His death and resurrection that Jesus pours out the Holy Spirit on the Apostles. This is the same Holy Spirit whom Christ the head pours out on his members, builds, animates and sanctifies the Church, The Church is the sacrament of Holy Trinity's communion with humanity.

Servant's Reflection ... Some time ago I was invited to a 50th year celebration for a construction company. I remember trying to determine the best clothing attire to wear. I didn't want to show up in work clothes nor did I want to show up in a tie and dress shirt, assuming neither would be in line with the rest of the guests. I showed up in nice jeans and a collared shirt only to find most of the guests had dress shirts, ties, and dress pants. How we dress sometimes embodies who we are, our purpose, and how important an occasion is to us. Take for instance a wedding, the gal wearing the beautiful white dress, we know she's getting married. At mass when we see a man wearing an outer garment such as an alb and/or chasuble with a thin cloth draped over his neck, a stole, we know he is the priest. Not as easily distinguishable though is a Christian, what do they look like? The outer garments of Christianity in most cases are not garments per se rather "garments" of action and expression. The question, do you put on the garments of Christianity for others to see? Is there cheerfulness in your voice and on your face? Do you build others up, even if it hurts you? Do you show the importance of a wedding or Mass to others by the way you dress? Our mission on this earth is not to do what our neighbors do and to blend in, rather to exemplify Christ Jesus in all that we do, even if we stand-out doing it. Consider this next week wearing your finest Christian "garments" and be outspoken in your dress when you attend Mass. Consider when you meet others on the street, let the smile God gave you be seen by others...let others know you are of the Easter People! God gave us one life to live but opportunities abound to prove who we love most, Christ Jesus. It our job to put the "garments" of Christianity on for others to see.
