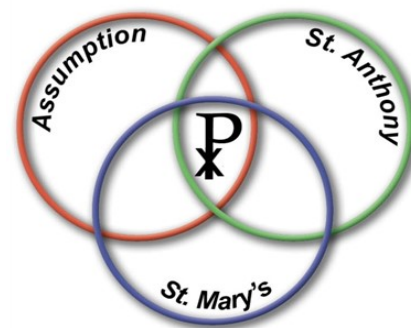

Pope's Tweet ... ***"Meek and humble of heart, close to the people, with compassion, with meekness and tenderness. This is Jesus."***

Father's Corner ... September 29th, is the Feast of the Archangels – Michael, Gabriel and Raphael. Traditionally the angels are divided into 9 ranks or choirs. Pope St. Gregory the Great wrote in one of his homilies that there were nine levels of angels. Each level has their own task to do given by God. These 9 levels or choirs are divided into 3 groups. Nine choirs: Seraphim, Cherubim, Thrones, Dominations, Virtues, Powers, Principalities, Archangels and Guardian Angels. This is not Church doctrine but it does give us a way to organize our thinking and understanding.

St. Paul says in Eph 1,21 that Christ is raised up, "above all principality, power, and virtue and dominion." And in Colossians 1,16 he says, "In Him were all things created in heaven and earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominations, or principalities or powers."

Of the Archangels: there are seven as Raphael says in Tobit 12,15. Raphael says that he is "one of the seven angels who enter and serve before the Glory of the Lord." Scripture reveals the name of three of the others: Michael is one of the Chief Princes, Dn 10,13,21. Gabriel is named in Dn 8,16; 9,21. Other angels who are named in apocryphal books of the Old Testament are Uriel, Ragucl, Sariel, Jeremiel, Phanuel. Notice they all end in "el", this "el" meand God.

Satan: the name means adversary as a verb, it is hostile towards, to attack, accuse or to act as an adversary. Originally Satan was a good angel and was created by God. Satan chose evil. He was seen as the equal of Archangel Michael; therefore, he was an Archangel, some scholars think he was a Seraphim instead. In the book of Job; he is the Heavenly prosecutor. The name "Lucifer" was given to Satan in the 300's AD. It is from the Latin for Lightbearer and is given to Satan because Jesus said "I saw Satan like lightning falling from the heaven" Lk 10,18 and Isa 14,12. "How are you fallen from heaven, O day-star, son of the dawn?"

Notice how we have 9 names, so if 7 are Archangels then 2 must be at a different level.
