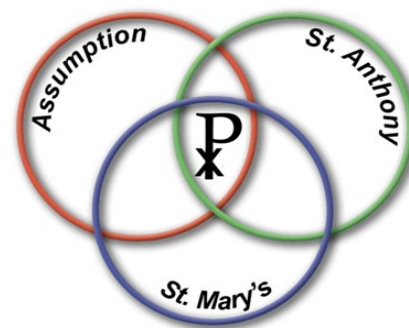

Father's Corner ... Today is Respect for Life Sunday, so I want to write about Respect for Life. *"Human life is sacred because from its beginning it involves the creative action of God and it remains for ever in a special relationship with the Creator, who is its sole end. God alone is the Lord of life from its beginning until its end: no one can under any circumstance claim for himself the right directly to destroy an innocent human being"* (CCC 2258 citing The Gift of Life no 5). What this means is that we are created by God and His creative action is present in every human being and this makes every human life sacred from the moment of conception until natural death.

Humans are created in God's image (Gn 1:27). God breathes His Spirit into humanity to give us life (Gn2:7). Therefore, in all human beings, God is present. So life is sacred!

Another reason why all Human life is sacred is because of the Incarnation. God took upon Himself the mantle of human existence, becoming like us in all things but sin. (GS 22; Cf Heb 4:15). God became human, Jesus, to save us. God did not become any other of His creation. He became human. This makes all Human life Sacred.

A third reason human life is Sacred is the Command of Jesus to "Love your neighbor as yourself" (Mt 22:39). If we love our neighbor we do not do others harm and they do not do us harm.

A fourth reason human life is Sacred is The Fifth Commandment, "You shall not kill" (Ex 20:13) calls each of us to foster the physical, spiritual, emotional and social well-being of ourselves and all others. We are called to create a culture of life! Any life threatening acts are opposed to this culture of life and violate the Fifth (5th) Commandment: like murder, abortion, euthanasia. Denial of medical care, just wages for work done, unjust imprisonment and unjust or optionally imposed death penalty, unjust war and terrorism all threaten a Culture of Life. [note that I have used certain adjectives with care and purpose].
