

Father's Corner ... Marriage continued: 2. The world sees marriage on TV as only romantic, that it can be dissolved when one partner is not happy, or that it is a legal contract for determining property and responsibilities. This is not a true understanding of marriage! We see Marriage as a SACRAMENT. It is a covenant. A sacrament is "An outward sign instituted by Christ for the giving of His grace. A Marriage is something we do - the wedding ceremony - that was given by Christ - the Wedding in Cana - for the giving of His grace to the married couple to join them together as God intended. The ongoing outward sign of the Sacrament of Marriage is the couple's love for each other. Their love is the sign and proof of the presence of God. We can not see God, but we can see a husband's and wife's love for each other. In the love of marriage, we see the invisible Love of God made visible for us.

You, as spouses, become the sacraments of God's love for a religious from this area or serving each other, and His presence and forgiveness. And you become a sign of all this to the whole world. Each time you open yourself up to your spouse in love you give and receive this sacrament. You get married 1 time, but you receive the sacrament of marriage each day. You live out this sacrament by being life giving to each other on an ongoing bases; as you seek the growth of your partner and yourself.

Pray together. In our society we have a 49% success rate in marriages. If a couple goes to church together that becomes a 71% success rate and if they also pray together they have a 97%

A Servant's Reflection . . . With the recent drop in temperatures outside, and after being in the early morning air for hours the other morning, walking into a house that had a wood stove going felt so good. When I walked through the room with the stove and passing by it I felt as though I had no choice but to stop.
