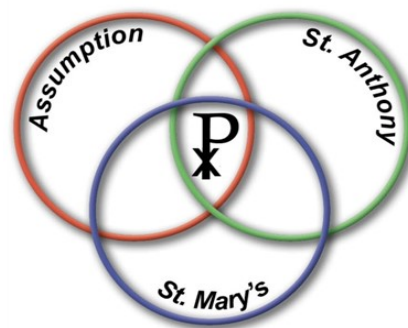

Father's Corner ... Marriage continued
 4: Rules for active discussions better known as arguments.
 1: USE I STATEMENTS. "I feel _____ when you do _____." Do not use statements like, "You make me so mad when you do _____." When using "I" statements, you claim responsibility for your feelings. Your feelings are yours and no one else's. 2nd is if you use the "You make me" statements then your spouse is immediately put on the defensive and communication is stopped because they will be trying to defend themselves instead of listening to you.
 2: STAY IN THE PRESENT (No past history.) Do not bring up things they did or did not do or say from 6 months or 60 years ago. What was done in the past is not important. If it was then you should have brought it up then. Stay present day only.
 3: DO NOT use the silent treatment. This is where you do not talk for hours or days. This is a deliberate break of communications. And COMMUNICATIONS is the most important link in marriage.
 4: NO NAME CALLING (except those affectionate names).
 5: NO THIRD PARTIES: (the argument is between you and your spouse.)
 6: STICK TO THE SUBJECT (find the subject and do not go to other issues to prove your point.)
 7: DON'T HIT BELOW THE BELT (don't throw your partner's weakness in his/her face; you may win the battle but lose the war.)
 8: DO NOT GO TO BED ANGRY (finish the argument, or at least get to the point you can agree to live with disagreeing.)
 9: MAINTAIN A SENSE OF HUMOR (laughter is sometimes the best medicine.)
 10: NO THROWING ITEMS, AND ABSOLUTLY NO HITTING! No shouting. If you feel that you are going to lose control then say, "I need to take a break and calm down." Then leave the room and walk around the house or yard to calm down. If your spouse says it, then let them go and cool down. When you are calmer then come back and continue the discussion.
 11: SIT DOWN AND HOLD HANDS. while you are discussing/arguing. This helps you remember your love and keeps you from hitting or throwing things.
 12: ! This step is FOR MARRIED COUPLES ONLY! If you know it is going to be an emotional and anger filled discussion. Go into a private room, remove what you are wearing, sit together and hold hands. Humans can only put out so much energy at one time. In this case your energy will be split. You cannot get as angry in this case.
