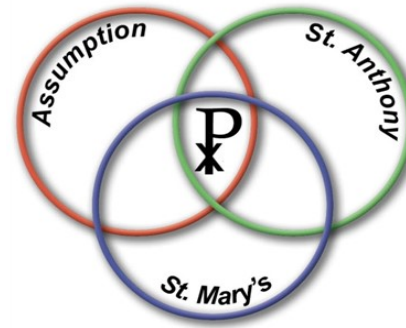

A Servant's Reflection . . . Not enough time! Years ago, I remember talking to a vender about an item we needed, and the situation required talking again the next day on the phone. I told the lady I was talking to at the time that I was too busy so it would work best for me if she would give me a call back the next day. In a humbling moment that has stuck with me to this day she told me, "Ryan, we are all busy". She was right!

We often find ourselves busy, many times too busy. The implied business has a way of rearranging for us, frequently without our consent, what is important in our lives. For each of us what **IS** priority and what ends up being priority are not the same. I see this for myself. Ideally, my priority list would be God, Family, Work, and Deacon Formation. It doesn't always actually get arranged in that order.

We were all created in God's image and likeness. With that, God gave each of us enough of everything; that includes time, time to make Him a priority- the top priority! Is God on the top each of our priority lists? Do we have enough time for God, the time he gave us?

How does your morning look, is God one of the first things you think about? Does your family, which was given to you by God, know they rate above work and your self-interests/ hobbies, if not why? How about Sunday's, do you go to Mass and do only things that are necessary? God gave us enough time so if we can't fit Him, or the things and people He put in our lives like our family in, maybe we don't have our priorities straight.

Could we all consider our priority lists as we start a new year? Write down on paper what your priorities are, top to bottom. Then reflect on how you live your days. Are your priorities and the end result the same? God has given us enough time; we just need to make sure OUR plan is HIS plan. Make the time!

Father's Corner:

When an old man died in the geriatric ward of a nursing home in an Australian country town, it was believed that he had nothing left of any value. Later, when the nurses were going through his meager possessions, they found this poem. Its quality and content so impressed the staff that copies were made and distributed to every nurse in the hospital. One nurse took her copy to Melbourne. The old man's sole bequest to posterity has since appeared in the Christmas editions of magazines around the country and appearing in magazines for Mental Health. A slide presentation has also been made based on his simple, but eloquent, poem. And this old man, with nothing left to give to the world, is now the author of this 'anonymous' poem winging across the Internet.

Cranky Old Man

What do you see nurses? . . . What do you see?
What are you thinking . . . When you're looking at me?
A cranky old man . . .not very wise,
Uncertain of habit . . .with faraway eyes?
Who dribbles his food . . .and makes no reply.
